## Writing Essays and Opinion Pieces

Students write a series of short essays in this residency—using the teacher’s chosen subject area and goals. We will be learning and practicing: unity, writing leads and endings, style, reducing word clutter, transitions, and balancing opinion with factual information. We’ll design essays for: school papers, print media, radio and the internet. Students will do research to get facts and information about their topic using interviews, internet, books and/or magazines. The focus is to learn these skills while building the students’ self esteem, because in an essay it is the author’s point of view that gives the writing zest.
